



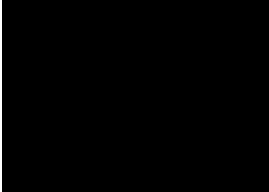
County Honours

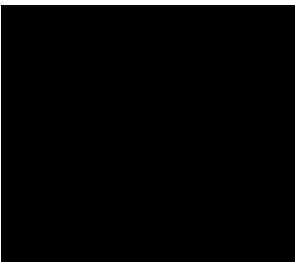

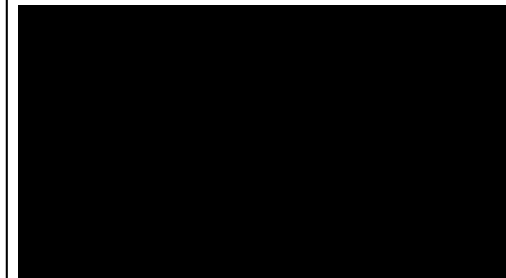

'An Angel in my Bath' - Illustration Workshop.

'An Angel in my Bath' by Anita Flowers is a children's book soon to be published. In an event sponsored by Academi, forty GCSE art pupils took part in a four day workshop to create illustrations for the story. The images made were inspired by Eric Carle's technique of illustration – pictures made from a variety of hand tinted & patterned tissue papers collaged to create simple, but beautifully coloured and textured images.

Anita was very impressed by the amount of quality work produced and aims to use a variety of these images throughout the book and not just one section as originally intended. One student commented, 'I thought it was right up my street. I got to draw lots of mythical creatures which I really enjoy doing.' Another said, 'It was a good learning experience. It was good looking at how artists' work and seeing other people's interpretations.' All round it was a great four days and it will definitely help towards our GCSEs, with the bonus of some seeing their work in print.

Raul Speek—Workshop

On the 16th June, a Year 9 Art group went to Raul Speek's Art Exhibition at the Library in Haverfordwest. It consisted of fish, waves, palm trees, water melons and everything to do with the Caribbean, a Cuban theme. As we painted, Raul told us to be free making large brush movements, filling the space with paint, and to be enthusiastic as this was a different type of painting for all of us. Then after about an hour painting, we had finally finished our picture and came back to school full of thoughts and ideas.
